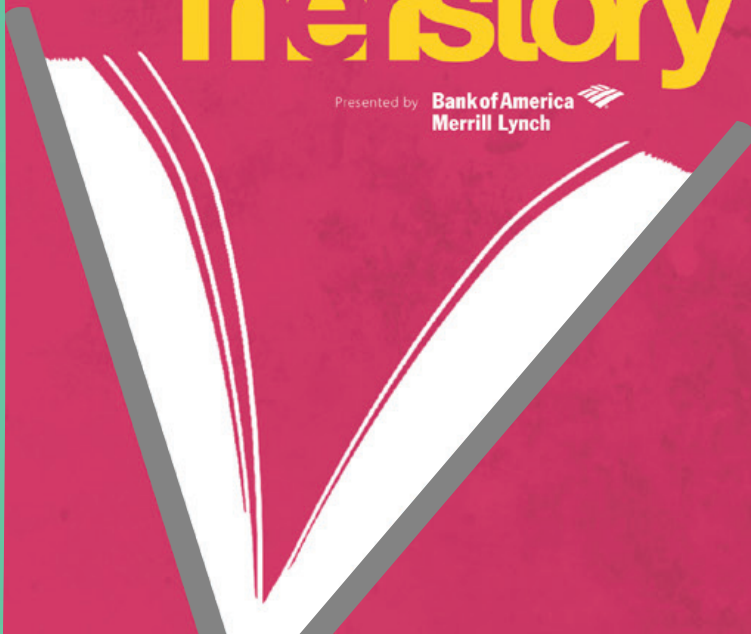

Mark Pestrella

Director, Los Angeles County Public Works

Mark Pestrella is the Director of Los Angeles County Public Works. In this capacity, he serves as the County Engineer, the County Road Commissioner, and the Chief Engineer of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District. With an annual budget of more than \$2.7 billion and a workforce of 4,000 employees, Los Angeles County Public Works is the largest municipal public works agency in the United States, providing vital public infrastructure and civic services to more than 10 million people across a 4,000-square-mile service area. Public Works' diverse operations are defined within six core service areas: Water Resources, Transportation, Environmental Services, Public Buildings, Developmental Services, and Emergency Management.

Mr. Pestrella is a licensed civil engineer and a 32-year veteran of Public Works and has held a variety of management positions. He is a native of Southern California and attended California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo, where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in civil engineering with concentrations in structural engineering and water resource management.



Kathryn Barger

5th District Supervisor, Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors

Supervisor Kathryn Barger proudly serves the residents of Los Angeles County's 5th Supervisorial District — the county's largest — spanning 2,800 square miles, which includes 22 cities and 70 unincorporated communities in the San Gabriel, San Fernando, Crescenta, Santa Clarita and Antelope Valleys.

Kathryn was born and raised in the 5th District and comes from a family with deep roots in public service in Los Angeles County. She is married to a retired sheriff's deputy and lives in the San Gabriel Valley.

Dedicated to providing effective, responsive representation to the residents of Los Angeles County, Kathryn began her career in public service as a college intern in the office of Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich and rose to become his Chief Deputy in 2001, where she served until her election to the Board of Supervisors in November 2016.

During the course of her County career as Chief Policy Advisor on health, mental health, social services and children's issues, Kathryn ensured efficient and effective services and programs to significantly improve the quality of life for foster children, seniors, veterans, those with disabilities, and those with mental illness.

Committed to keeping our neighborhoods and communities safe, she has worked with state and federal leaders and our county district attorney, sheriff, and other law enforcement agencies to implement tough laws and vital public safety initiatives.

She is an advocate for the environment and efforts to preserve open space, enhance parks, trails, recreational programs and facilities, as well as libraries and after-school programs to serve local communities.

Sachi Hamai

CEO, Los Angeles County

Sachi A. Hamai is the Chief Executive Officer of Los Angeles County. She is responsible for managing the strategic direction and day-to-day operations of the nation's largest municipal government, including the oversight of Los Angeles County's \$32.5 billion budget. She has led Los Angeles County to achieving its overall highest credit rating in its recorded history. Los Angeles County has achieved a total of four credit upgrades achieved under CEO Hamai's leadership.

As CEO, Sachi Hamai is instrumental in developing, implementing and advancing the Board of Supervisors' key priorities. These include the unprecedented response to the region's homeless crisis, streamlining access to health services, justice reform, child protection, immigrant rights protection and environmental monitoring and oversight.

In 2019, Sachi was named one of L.A.'s Top 500 most influential leaders for the fourth consecutive year by the Los Angeles Business Journal. Her honors include the Innovate@UCLA 2019 Public Sector Executive Leadership Award, the Clarence A. Dykstra 2018 Award for Excellence in Government, the Asian American Architects and Engineers Association's 2017 Asian American Leadership Award, and honors from the Asian American Employee Association and the Indian American Professional Association. Sachi also co-founded WomenLeadLAC in 2017 as a forum for networking up-and-coming women in management with L.A. County's top executives. She serves on the board of United Way of Greater Los Angeles and is a member of the U.S.-Japan Council.



Janus Adams

LHD, ABD, Janus Adams LLC

Emmy Award-winning journalist, former NPR National Arts Correspondent, network news commentator, talk show host and producer for radio and television, historian, and bestselling author of eleven books, Dr. Janus Adams has been engaged by history and culture since childhood.

At the age of 8, Dr. Adams was one of the four "test children" selected to break New York's segregated school policy who transferred from their all-black school to take a place in an all-white school. At the age of 10, she was introduced to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. at New York's Riverside Church. "He asked what I was doing for 'our people.' I told him about what I was experiencing with my classmates. He lifted my chin and said that what we were doing was 'important.' That one gesture from him helped cleanse the wounds," said Adams.

Today, Dr. Adams is passing on the spirit of Dr. King's promise. Her Raised by Dr. King campaign aims to "inform, inspire, engage, and empower children" and their support systems of family and community. Dr. Adams is a host and co-executive producer of public radio, television, and podcast, "The Janus Adams Show." Dr. Adams reminds her audiences to celebrate what makes us whole, confront the past and its legacies, and conjure the future. It's about "history and healing."

Shiza Shahid

Founder, NowVentures, Co-Founder and Founding CEO, Malala Fund

Shiza Shahid is an entrepreneur, technologist, investor and impact leader. She co-founded the Malala Fund with Nobel Prize winner Malala Yousafzai, and led the organization as founding CEO. She focused on creating access to high quality education for all children around the world.

Shiza launched NOW Ventures in Silicon Valley, in partnership with AngelList, the largest Venture Capital Platform in the world. She invests in mission-driven technology startups that are solving the world's most pressing challenges through technology, innovation, and high-growth business models. Shiza is also the founder of The Collective, a community of leading entrepreneurs that come together to build collaborative change. Additionally, Shiza is the host of the new USA Today show "ASPIREist," which inspires millennials to take action on the issues that matter most.

Shiza is passionate about the future of impact through technology; she studied exponential technologies at Singularity University, which is dedicated to applying futuristic innovations to advancing humanity. Shiza also graduated from Stanford University with University Distinction. She was a business analyst with McKinsey & Company.

Shiza is renowned for her work, receiving many awards as a thought leader. She was named one of TIME's "30 Under 30 People Changing the World," Forbes "30 Under 30 - Social Entrepreneurs" and a Tribeca Institute Disruptive Innovator. Director of New Student and Leadership Programs, UC Irvine

As the founding Director of the UCI's Center for Student Leadership (CSL), mike oversees new undergraduate student orientation, and manages an array of student leadership programs and resources. In addition, he instructs multiple classes including Thrive@UCI, Lead@UCI, Healthy Masculinity, and an annual seminar on Racial Justice Allyship.

Since coming to UCI in 2007 as the Interim Assistant Director of New Student Programs, mike has steadily taken on increasing responsibility and grown the department, first to New Student and Leadership Programs in 2014 when he became the Director, and now to the Center for Student Leadership. In that time he has twice been recognized as Mentor of the Year for the student organization Challenging All Men to Prevent Sexism, and has served as a three time keynote speaker for UCI's Take Back the Night. Outside of UCI, he has been a regular speaker and consultant on issues related to power, privilege, and allyship and to promoting healthy masculinity and racial justice.

In 2006 mike earned his Masters degree in Higher Education and Organizational Change from UCLA where he held a Research Assistantship focused on diversity in higher education and pathways to college for underrepresented students. He earned his Bachelors degree from UCI in Psychology and Social Behavior in 2003.

Adrian Williams

Program Coordinator, UC Irvine Womxn's Hub

Hi, I'm Adrian! I am a Marriage and Family Therapist Trainee, the Program Coordinator at UC Irvine's Womxn's Center, and the Founder of Do Tell podcast. I was born, raised, and currently reside in Southern California. My personal mantra is to "be the change I wish to see in the world," and I knew my calling was intrinsically tied to becoming a psychotherapist and mentor. Prior to starting this work, as I came of age, I began to question my sexuality. I sought out therapy to help reconcile the cognitive dissonance I felt regarding my sexuality and Christian beliefs. However, I did not feel seen, understood, or supported by my therapist. This distressing experience nearly detoured me from entering this helping profession, but in the end, it inspired me to become the therapist I needed when I was younger.

Ultimately, it is my mission to utilize my education and skillset to serve the LGBTQ community, young adults, and people of color as they work towards holistic wellness, the fulfillment of their academic and career goals, and evolving into their best self. I will do so drawing on my B.A. in Sociology, as well as my M.S. in Counseling Psychology with a concentration as a Professional Clinical Counselor and a certification in Interprofessional Education.

Tatiana Lee

Actor, Model, Hollywood Inclusion Influencer, Accessible Hollywood

Tatiana Lee is an award-winning actress, model, beauty and lifestyle influencer born with Spina Bifida. Lee felt invisible to the rest of society because she didn't see anyone that looked like her in popular media growing up in Coatesville, PA. She moved to LA to pursue her passions further. Tatiana realized that wheelchair accessibility was a significant barrier for her and wanted to shed insight on her perspective; thus AccessibleHollywood.com was born. Which aims to make Hollywood entertainment accessible and inclusive to people with disabilities. She has spoken to many people about disability in entertainment including on behalf of SAG-AFTRA, Film Independent, and Apple Inc. to name a few. She received the Christopher Reeves Actors Scholarship during Media Access Award in 2018 for her contribution in modeling and film. She was in one of Apple's first ad campaigns featuring people with disabilities using Apple's accessible features and products.

Tatiana can be seen in Jade, the TV Short, which won an award at Omni Cultural TV Festival, Viral videos like Coffee with Tim Cook, CEO of Apple, and modeling campaigns for Parfait Lingerie, Zappos Adaptive, Apple and more.

Her story has appeared in magazine outlets, newspapers, and viral segments across the world including on LifetimeTV, in Singapore and the third largest newspaper in Japan. She currently attends Upright Citizens Brigade Improv Theater as a 3x Diversity Scholarship recipient. Tatiana loves beauty, fashion, fitness, hosting and attending events with her peers, and has dedicated her life to fighting for inclusion of people with disabilities in all aspects of mass media.

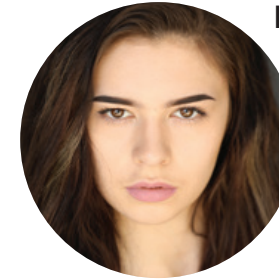

Before joining Violet Grey, Martinez-Rea was a Vice President of Change Management for Yahoo!'s Global Products organization, responsible for leading the cross-functional change efforts to improve engineering quality and overall organizational effectiveness for a 6,000-person global division. Previous roles at Yahoo! include Senior Director of Strategy and Business Management, Global Products, and Senior Director of Strategy and Business Operations and Chief of Staff to EVP Yahoo! North America. She also acted as the executive sponsor for the Southern California chapter of Women in Technology.

Martinez-Rea was recognized by Sports Business Journal as a 2018 Game Changer. She also serves on the board of Young & Healthy, a non-profit dedicated to providing healthcare to underserved children. She holds dual undergraduate degrees in English Literature and Gender Studies from the University of Southern California.

LUNCHTIME PROGRAM



Nicole Maines

Transgender Youth Advocate

Nicole Maines grew up in Portland, Maine with her brother, Jonas, her mother, Kelly and father, Wayne. When she was four-years-old she started telling her family, community, and state who she was. Every step of the way she has worked with her classmates and community to be open and honest so everyone could learn and grow throughout the process. Unfortunately some people continued to fear the unknown. This fear impacted Nicole and her family's ability to lead a normal life. These fears changed her world and her family's world forever.

Because of this painful journey, Nicole has become a strong woman with a clear and loud voice for safety and equality. She has been recognized nationally for fighting to make sure transgender students have the same rights as their classmates. In January of 2014 the Maine's Supreme Court ruled that Nicole's rights had been violated under the state's Human Rights Act, marking a historic and landmark victory for transgender rights in the U.S. It is the first time a state's highest court has ruled that it is unlawful to deny transgender students access to the bathroom of the gender with which they identify.

The Maine ACLU, Equality Maine and Healthy Girls and Hardy Women have recognized Nicole for her courage, strength and commitment to promoting change. When she was just thirteen-years-old she worked closely with GLAD, Equality Maine, the ACLU and the Maine Women's Lobby to defeat LD 1046, a bill that would have rolled back transgender protections in Maine.

The body of her work focuses on helping campuses, non-profits, and other organizations build capacity for social justice and racial equity by empowering everyone to be strategic, transformational agents of change in their spheres of influence. She serves as the Chief Learning Officer and Director of the USC Equity Institutes at the USC Race and Equity Center, dedicated to advancing racial justice in higher education and other sectors. Prior to this position, Sumi held roles as the Assistant Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion at Harvey Mudd College and as the Director for USC Asian Pacific American Student Services. Sumi is a scholar-practitioner and was recently re-appointed to the Board of Directors for NADOHE, the national chief diversity officers' organization.

Pendakur is a graduate of Northwestern University with a double major in Women's Studies and History and a Minor in Spanish. She holds an M.A. in Higher Education Administration from the University of Michigan. She received her doctorate in Higher Education Leadership from the USC Rossier School of Education. In 2019, she was named one of the top 35 women in higher education by Diverse: Issues in Higher Education magazine.

Counselor/Consultant/Activist, Wild Fern Counseling, PLLC

Kelsey Domann-Scholz is passionate about helping people foster a sacred relationship with their bodies and heal wounds associated with diet-culture and disordered eating. In her work as a therapist, educator, and speaker in Durham, North Carolina, she works with clients of all genders on deconstructing Eurocentric and cis-normative beauty standards with the goal of making peace with food and reclaiming the inherent wisdom of the body. As an advocate for Intuitive Eating and Health at Every Size, Kelsey brings an understanding of the ways that colonization, racism, poverty, sexism, and other forms of oppression impact the ways we relate to and value bodies in healthcare settings.

She seeks to make the world a safer place for ALL BODIES.

Kelsey holds a masters degree in Professional Mental Health Counseling from Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon, completed post-masters coursework at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and is a Certified Intuitive Eating Counselor. She has been honored by the National Communication Association for her work in the field of interpersonal communication, has authored journal articles, and served as a reviewer and editorial assistant for multiple books and publications.

In addition to providing individual counseling services, Kelsey leads Intuitive Eating support groups, facilitates mindfulness and body acceptance retreats, co-facilitates a meditation group for therapists, and serves as a speaker and consultant related to eating disorder prevention and treatment. Sheila Kuehl

3rd District Supervisor, Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors

Supervisor Sheila James Kuehl is currently the Chair of the Board of Supervisors representing Los Angeles County's Third District, where she has undertaken or collaborated in a number of initiatives and motions to improve the quality of life and reform systems in the County.

Supervisor Kuehl served eight years in the State Senate and six years in the State Assembly. She was the Founding Director of the Public Policy Institute at Santa Monica College and, in 2012, was Regents' Professor in Public Policy at UCLA.

She was the first woman in California history to be named Speaker Pro Tempore of the Assembly, and the first openly gay or lesbian person to be elected to the California Legislature. She served as chair of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, Natural Resources and Water Committee, and Budget Subcommittee on Water, Energy and Transportation, as well as the Assembly Judiciary Committee. Additionally, she authored 171 bills that were signed into law.

Prior to her election to the Legislature, as a public-interest attorney Supervisor Kuehl drafted and fought to get into California law more than 40 pieces of legislation relating to children, families, women, and domestic violence. She was a law professor at Loyola, UCLA and USC Law Schools and co-founded and served as managing attorney of the California Women's Law Center.



Anne-Marie Slaughter

CEO, New America

Anne-Marie Slaughter is CEO of New America and the Bert G. Kerstetter '66 University Professor Emerita of Politics & International Affairs at Princeton University. From 2009-2011 she served as director of Policy Planning for the US State Department, the first woman to do so. Prior to government.

Dr. Slaughter was Dean of Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School of Public & International Affairs from 2002-2009 and the J. Sinclair Armstrong Professor of International, Foreign, & Comparative Law at Harvard Law School from 1994-2002.

She has written or edited seven books including "The Chessboard and the Web: Strategies of Connection in a Networked World" and "Unfinished Business: Women Men Work Family" and is a frequent contributor to a number of publications including The Atlantic and Financial Times. In 2012 she published "Why Women Still Can't Have It All" in The Atlantic, which became one of the most read articles in The Atlantic's history and helped renew national debate on continued obstacles to full gender equality.

Diana Nyad

Record-Breaking Endurance Athlete & Sports Journalist

At the age of 64, in her fifth and final attempt, Diana Nyad successfully fulfilled her lifelong dream of completing the 110-mile swim from Cuba to Florida on September 2, 2013. Upon completing her grueling 53-hour journey, a breathless Nyad told the world, "I have three messages. One is we should never ever give up. Two is you are never too old to chase your dreams. And three is it looks like a solitary sport, but it takes a team."

Nyad has never been one to quit. In July of 2010, at the age of 60, she began her "Xtreme Dream" quest of swimming from Cuba to Florida, a task she had failed to finish thirty years previously. When asked her motivation, she replied, "Because I'd like to prove to the other 60-year-olds that it is never too late to start your dreams." Nyad was unsuccessful in her quest in 2010 and tried two more times 2011 and 2012 before completing the historic swim in 2013.

Back in the 1970's, Nyad was the greatest long-distance swimmer in the world. Her world records, such as circling Manhattan Island and crossing the 102.5 miles between the Bahamas and Florida, have led to inductions to many Halls of Fame, such as the International Women's Sports Hall of Fame.

Nyad became a prominent sports broadcaster, filing compelling reports for NPR, ABC's Wide World of Sports, Fox Sports, and The New York Times. She has written three books and speaks French and Spanish fluently. Nyad has also earned the reputation of a uniquely passionate and entertaining public speaker, earning standing ovations with a broad spectrum of audiences.

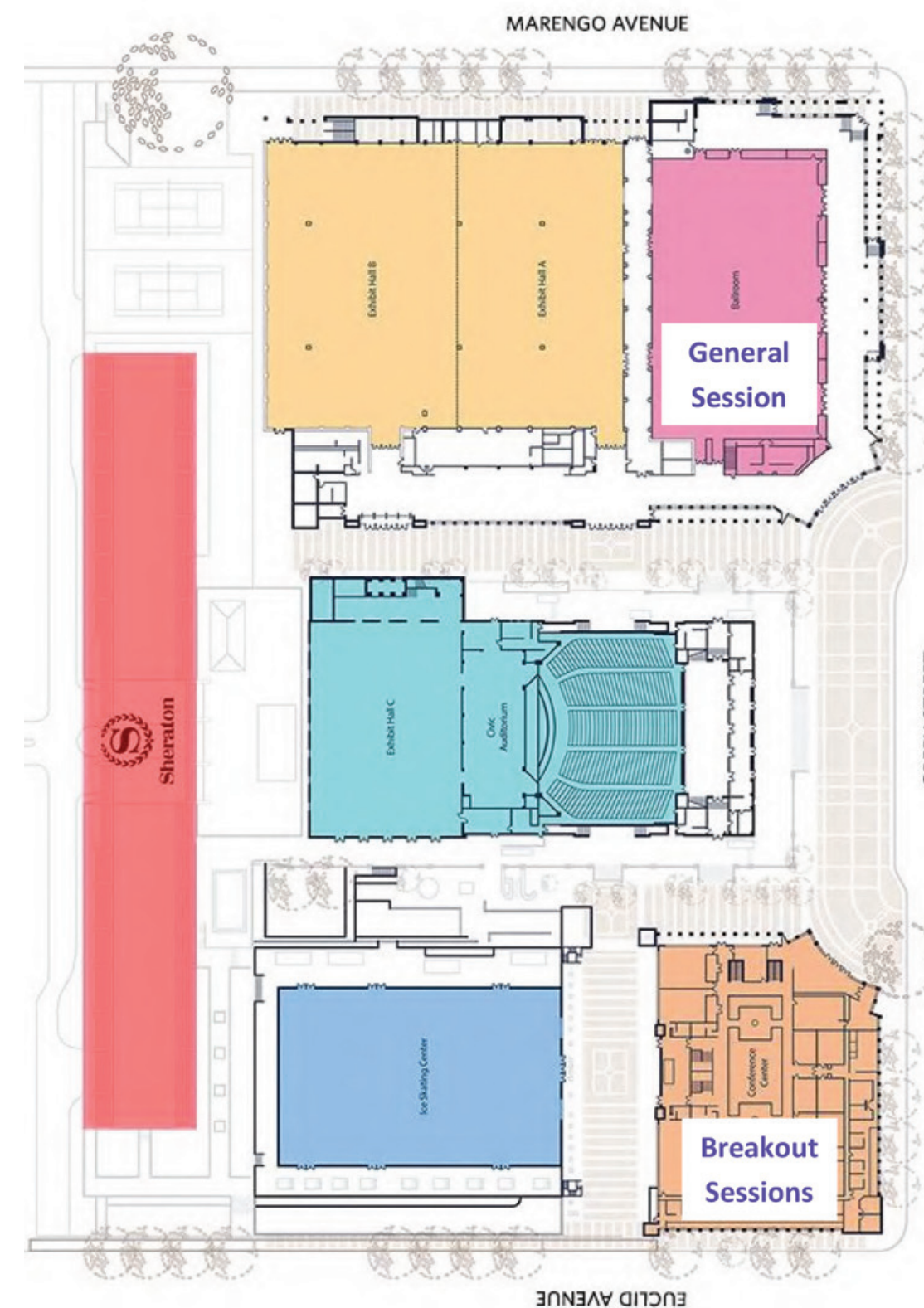
Healing from Diet Culture: Making the World Safer for All Bodies
